Summary

Effective January 1, 2021, Microsoft is increasing the price of Windows Remote Desktop Services Subscriber Access Licenses (RDS SALs) by 10 percent in the SPLA program.

Details

With significant investments in research and development, Microsoft continues to deliver cloud-ready innovations across its infrastructure products. Microsoft has also kept SPLA pricing consistent for 24 months for its RDS SALs. Microsoft will therefore increase Windows RDS SAL prices by 10 percent, effective January 1, 2021; regional or currency-specific price changes may apply. No other price changes will come into effect on January 1, 2021 for any other products in the SPLA program. The following product enhancements are being delivered at a faster pace so that partners and customers can take advantage of the new capabilities and innovations.

Web client product enhancements

- Enabled connection to Remote Desktop (RD) Broker without an RD Gateway in Windows Server 2019
- Offline use on internal networks now supported
- Broader support for Office shortcuts
- Single sign-on support for desktop and app connections

Protocol product enhancements

- 4K remoting improvements
- Multiple graphics processing units on server now supported
- Graphics classification and encoding improvements
- Improvements in network detection
- Camera redirection
